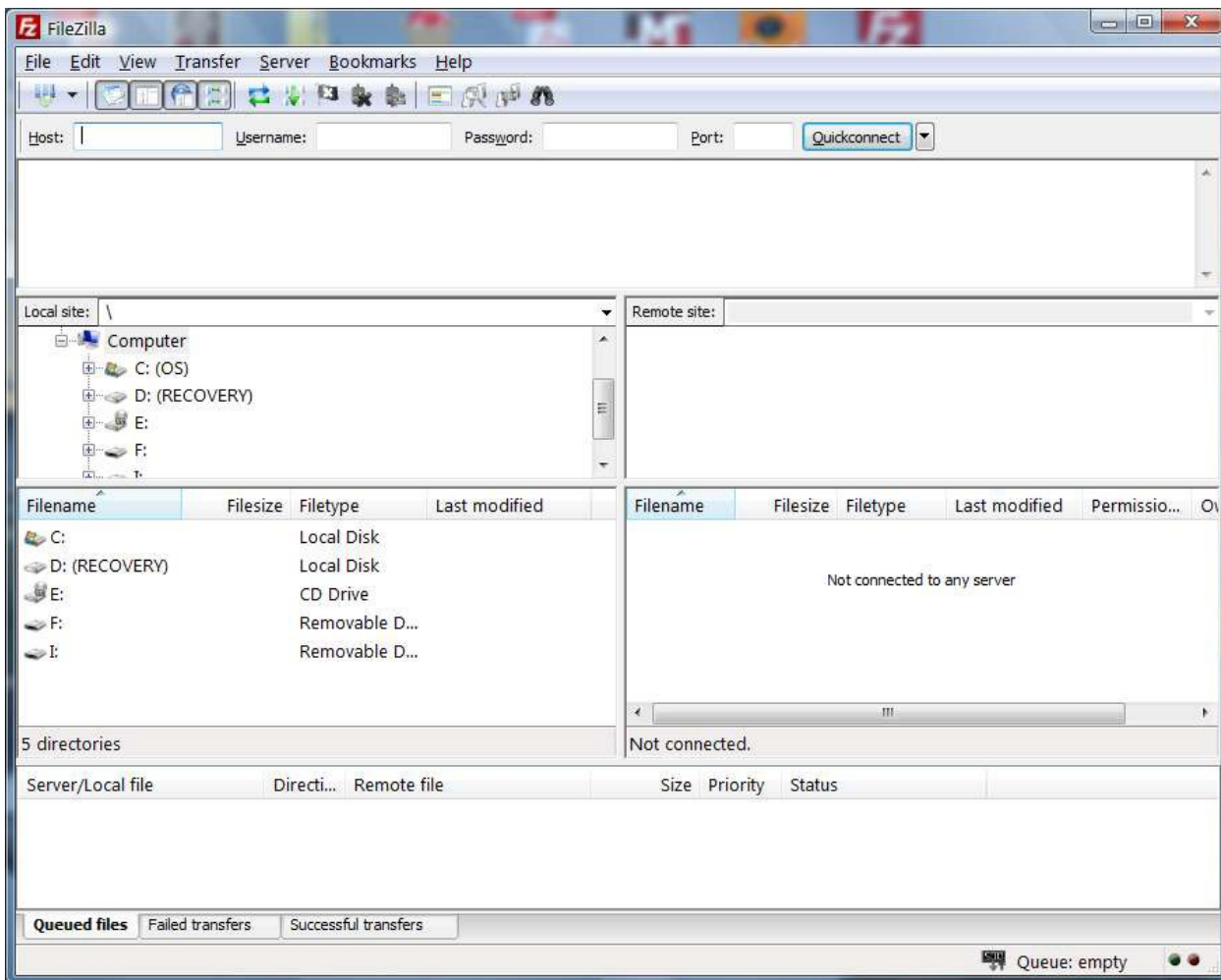


Configuring and Using Filezilla FTP Program

Once you have downloaded and installed the Filezilla software, the program will automatically launch, displaying the following screen:



To configure the software, click the File menu, click Site Manager, Click New Site, in the General tab, fill out:

Host: <ftp.internet-literacy.net>

Port: Leave blank

Protocol: FTP – File Transfer Protocol

Encryption: Require explicit FTP over TLS

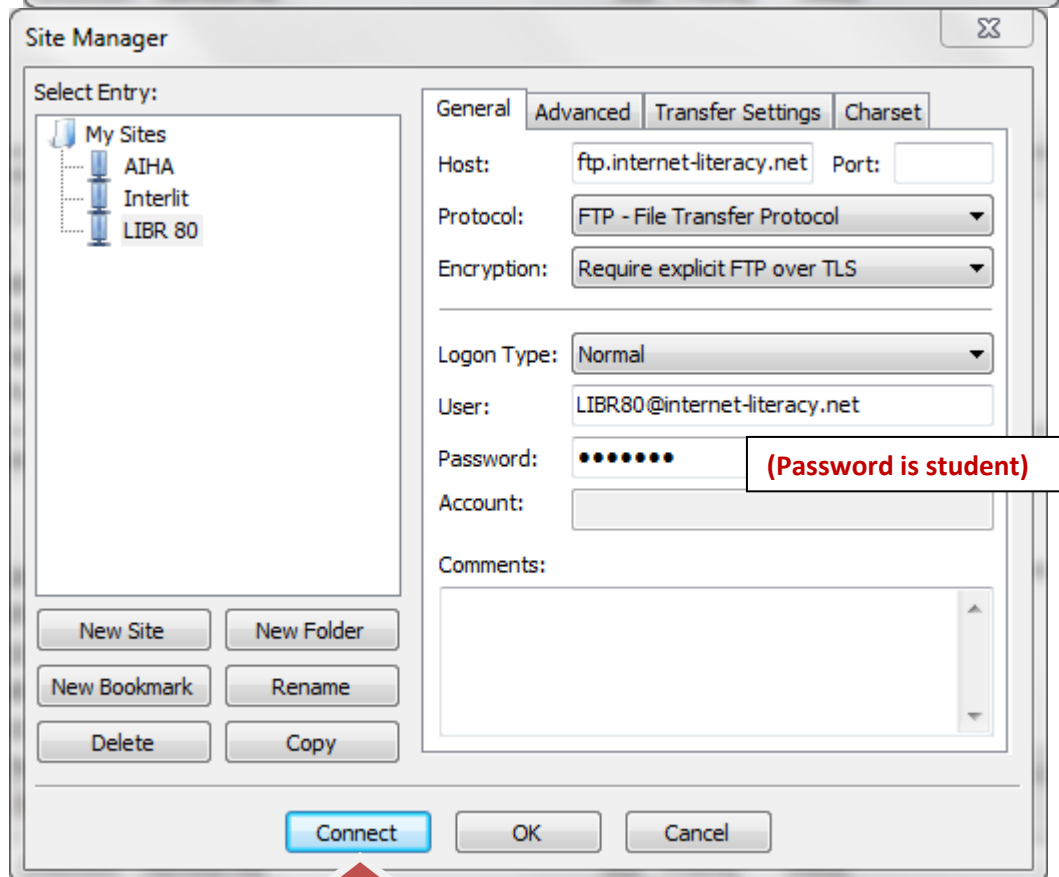
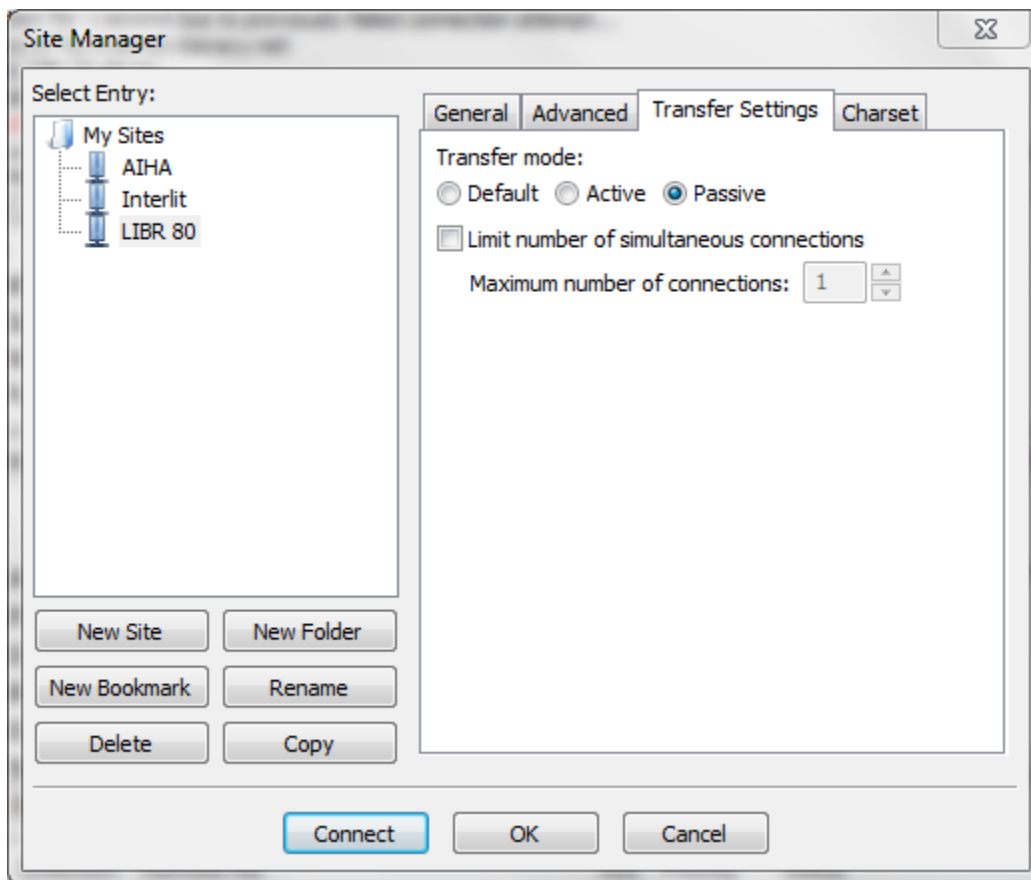
Logon Type: Normal

User: LIBR80@internet-literacy.net

Password: student

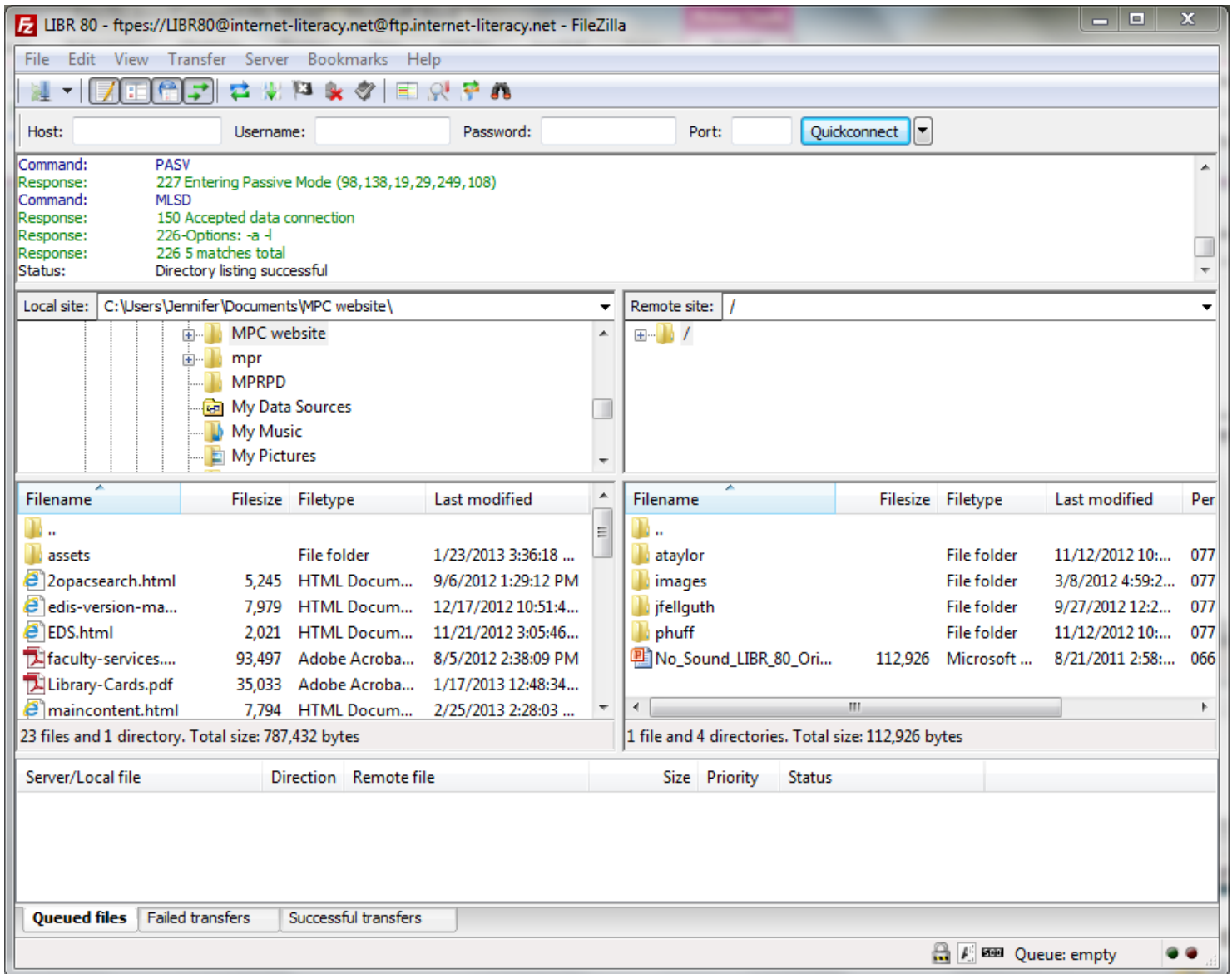
Click on the Transfer Settings tab and enable Passive Transfer Mode.

Click Connect (see examples below). The first time you connect using FTPS, you will get an “Unknown Certificate” pop up. This is expected behavior. Check the box “Always trust certificate in future sessions.” and you will not get this prompt again.

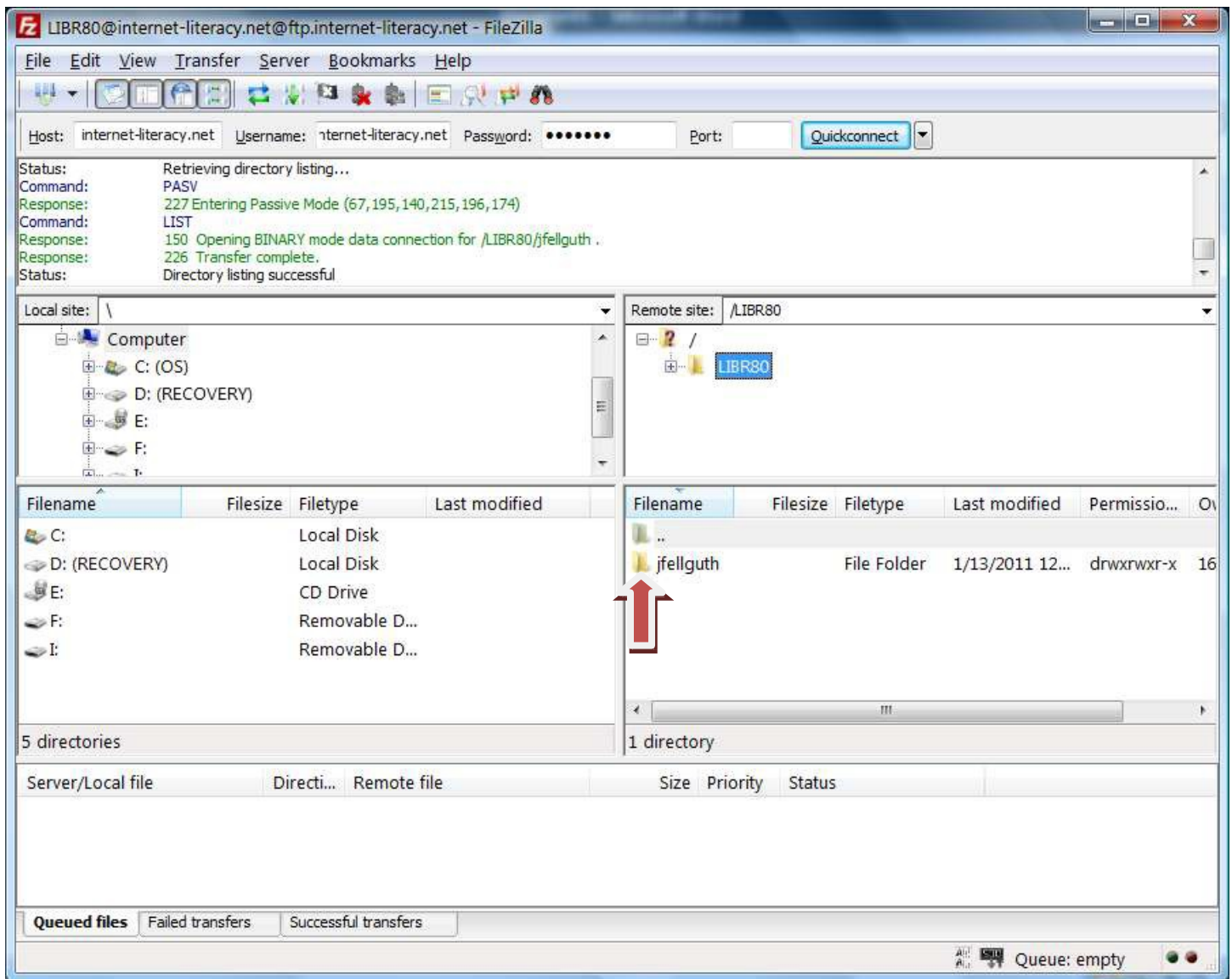


Click connect to establish a connection with the web server

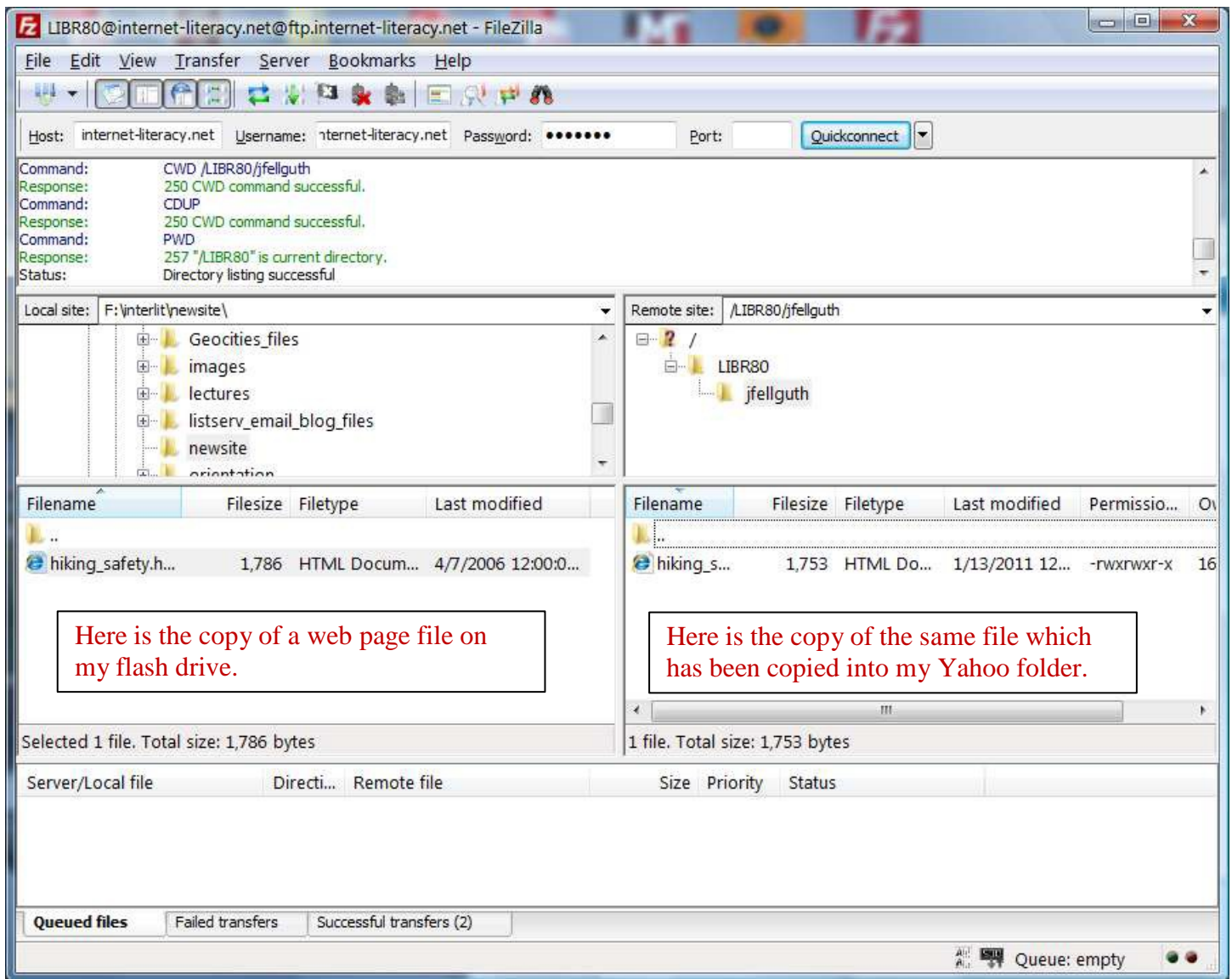
You will see a screen similar to this:



Notice that the left side of the screen displays your local drives. The right side of the screen displays the web server directory for our class. Start by locating the folder for your web files. For example, my folder will be called jfellguth.



To open the folder in preparation for moving my files, I will double click on the little folder icon as shown above. Once the folder is open, I can select the correct directory where I've stored my web page files as shown on the left, highlight the files I wish to move. Holding down the left mouse button, I can drag the web file shown on the left hand side of the screen into my folder on the Yahoo server, as shown on the right side of the screen. The file will be copied into my web server directory:



To view my newly published web file, I would type in the web address to first the Yahoo web server, including the name of my directory and the file I wish to display. In this case, the address would be:

http://internet-literacy.net/LIBR80/jfellguth/hiking_safety.html
