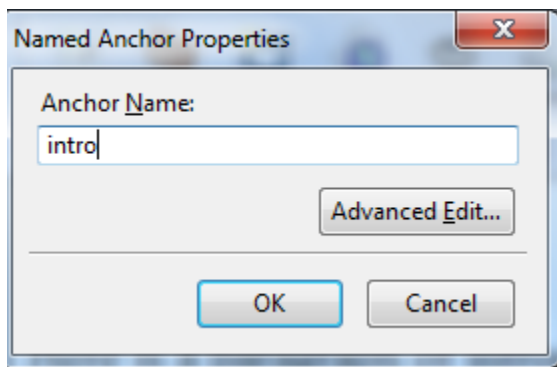


How to Insert Anchor Tags and Hyperlinks Using SeaMonkey

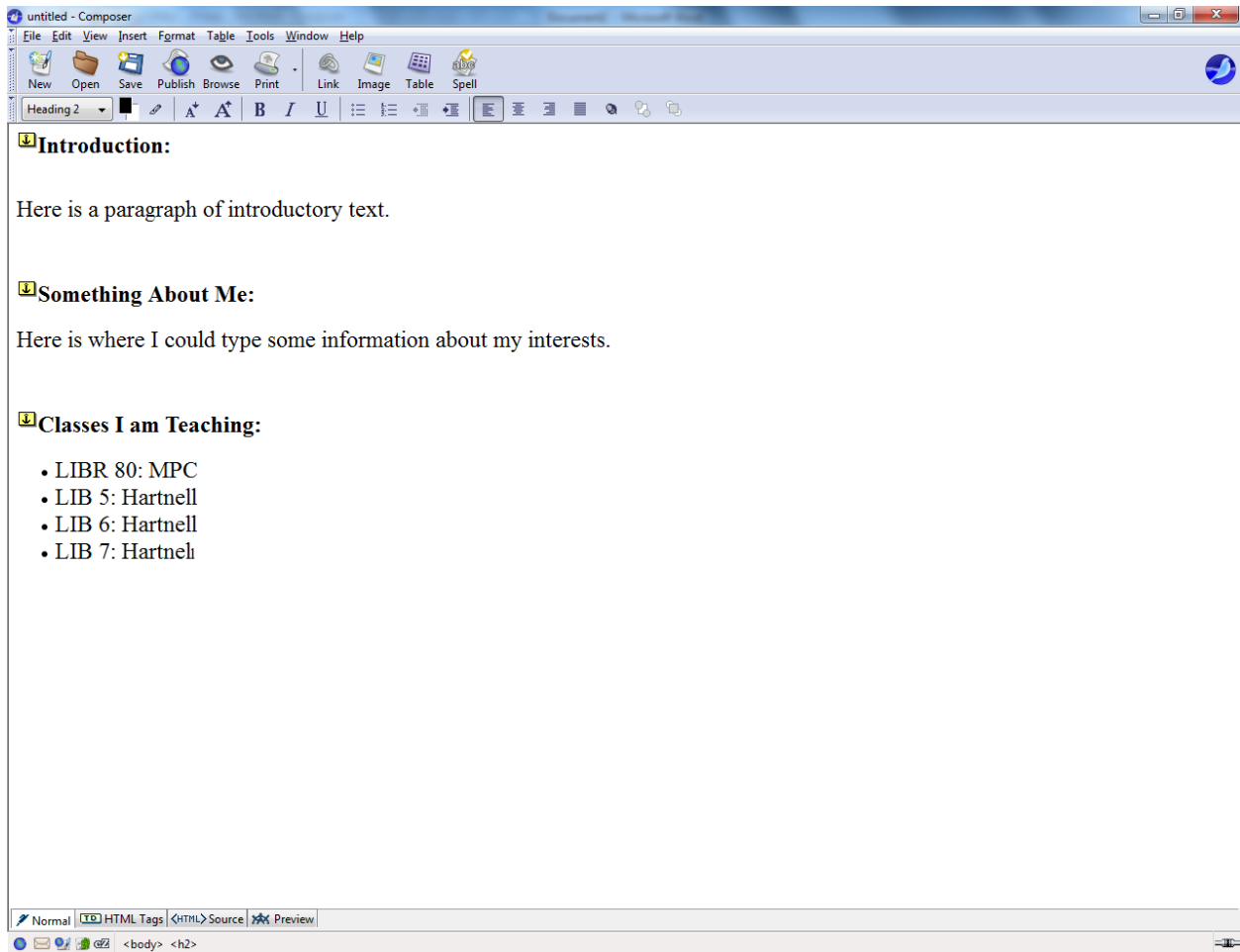
The purpose of anchor tags is to create a series of bookmarks that allow the person viewing a long web page to jump from one specific place on the page to another. This is accomplished by inserting an anchor tag at the place on the page to which you wish to jump and then inserting a hyperlink at the place you wish the clickable link to appear.

Start by opening your web page in the SeaMonkey Composer, then placing your cursor in front of the text to which you wish to jump. Click **Insert, Named Anchor**. Give your anchor a short name. Here's an example:

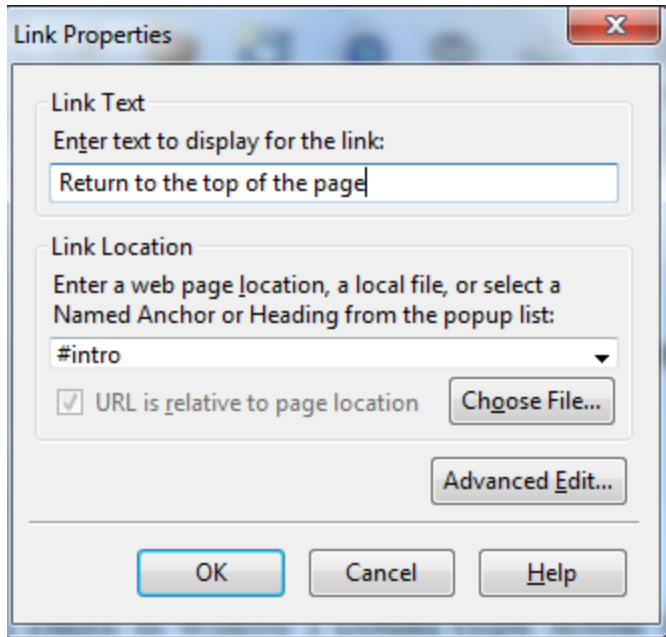


Click OK. Continue this process to place a named anchor in front of each paragraph, image, or line of text to which you wish to jump. Make sure you give each named anchor a unique name.

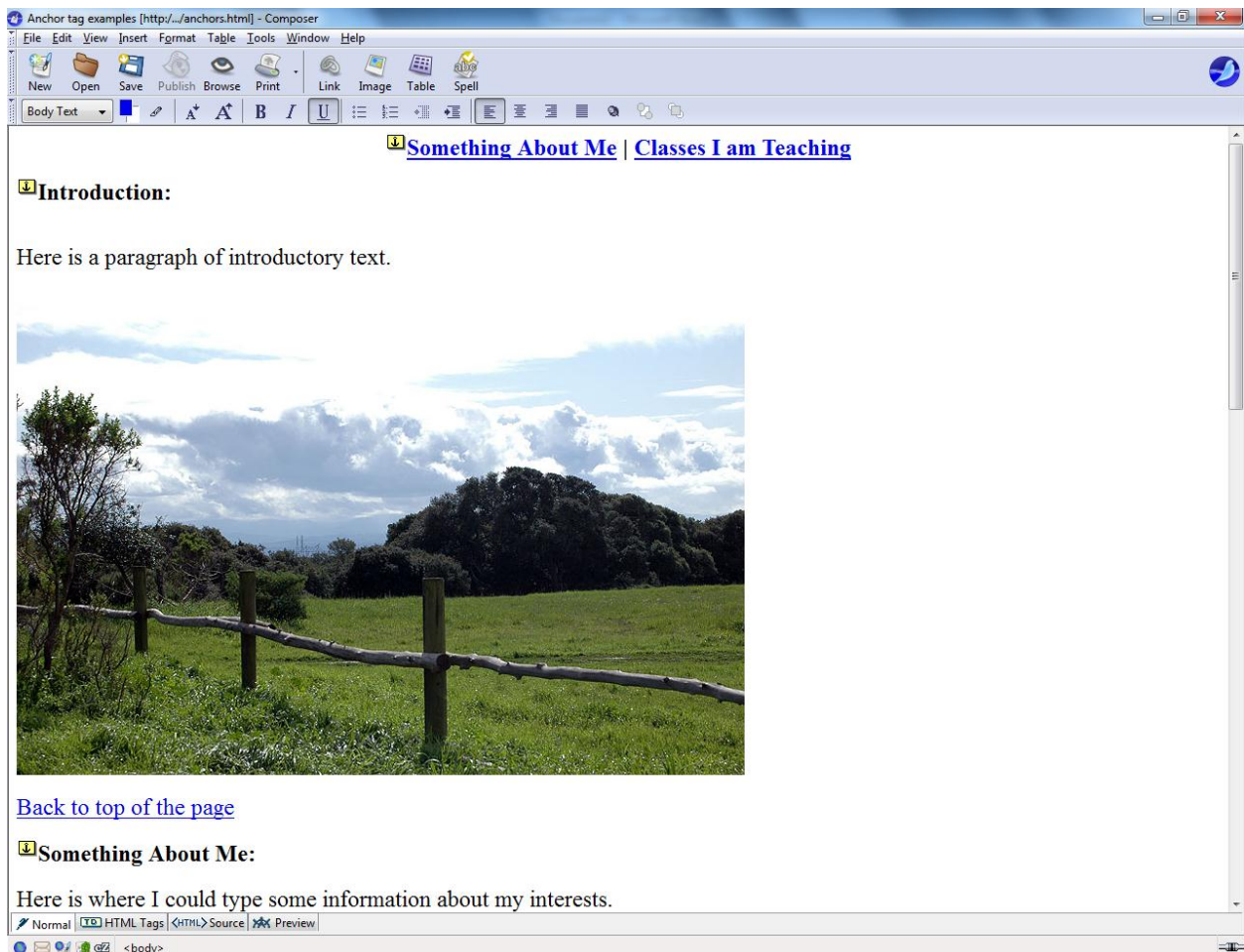
Once you have inserted your anchors, your Composer page will display a little anchor icon at each place on the page where you have inserted a named anchor tag:



Now you need to insert hyperlinks that will allow the page visitor to jump from one portion of the page to the other. Place your cursor at the location where you wish to insert the link. Click **Insert, Link**, enter the text you wish to appear as a link, then use the little drop down arrow on the right hand side of the link location field. This will allow you to select the named anchor to which you want the hyperlink to take you when clicked. For example:



Click OK.



Here is how the page will display once it is published:
